David Lewis teaches in the Department of Social Policy at the London School of Economics, where he has specialised in the research and teaching of development theory, policy and practice. Main interests include aid and development organizations; rural development; anthropology and development; and the South Asia region, with a particular focus on Bangladesh. He founded the LSE's MSc in the Management of Non-Governmental Organizations in 1995, the first course of its kind. An anthropologist by background, he is co-author with Katy Gardner of *'Anthropology, Development and the Postmodern Challenge'* (1996), co-editor with David Mosse of *'Development Brokers and Translators: The ethnography of Aid and Agencies'* (2006), and author of *'The Management of Non-Governmental Development Organizations'* (2007). His most recent book is *'Non-Governmental Organizations and Development'*, co-written with Nazneen Kanji (2008).
