Stephen Gill is a Distinguished Research Professor of Political Science, Communications and Culture at York University, Toronto, Canada. Recognized as an outstanding teacher & supervisor of PhD and MA students, Gill has received university-wide teaching awards on three separate occasions.

Gill is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and a Senior Associate Member of St. Anthony's College, Oxford University. He is also former Vice-President of the International Studies Association (ISA) and in 2006 he was elected as its Distinguished Scholar in International Political Economy.

His interests span political economy, political theory, sociology, international relations, law and cultural studies, including globalization, global governance and global civil society. His published work has addressed international relations theory, US hegemony and strategy, militarization, multilateralism and international organization as well as transatlantic and trilateral (US-EU-Japan) relations and European integration. He has published 11 books and about 100 refereed articles and essays. His book, *Power and Resistance in the New World Order* (Macmillan-Palgrave 2003) was winner of the Choice Outstanding Academic Award. It will be published in a second enlarged edition in May 2008, and it is forthcoming in Japanese translation. His most recent book is *Power, Production and Social Reproduction: Human Insecurity in the Global Political Economy* (co-editor Isabella Bakker, Macmillan-Palgrave 2004).

Works in progress include *The Constitution of Global Capitalism* and a book on US supremacy in world order. His recent work has been funded by grants from the Ford Foundation, Canadian Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, and the US Fulbright Commission.
