George Mathew is Founder Director, Institute of Social Sciences, New Delhi. He is member of several committees of the federal government and on the board of governors of national and international organizations. He has participated and presented in international conferences on political process, democracy, federalism, human rights, religion and society. He is currently specializing in the local government system, decentralization and gender equity. Some of the important academic positions he held are: Visiting Fellow of the University of Chicago South Asian Studies Centre (1981-82) and Visiting Professor, University of Padova (1988); awarded the Fulbright Fellowship in summer 1991 for working at the University of Chicago.

Major works include: *Communal Road to a Secular Kerala* and *Panchayati Raj - From Legislation to Movement*. He also has many edited works to his credit, including: *Shift in Indian Politics, Dignity for all: Essays in Socialism and Democracy; Panchayati Raj in Karnataka Today: Its National Dimensions; Panchayati Raj in Jammu and Kashmir; Status of Panchayati Raj in States of India 1994, and Status of Panchayati Raj in States of India in 2000*. He has contributed a number of research articles and papers to national and international academic and research journals and books.
