Global and Insurgent Legalities

Global and Insurgent Legalities explores the ways law and legal cultures travel within and beyond national jurisdictions (becoming global) and are critically reconfigured across a vast network of local, regional, national, transnational and global sites and actors (becoming insurgent). This series will pay particular attention to the ways Continental social and legal theories - typically associated with scholarship produced in the global north – are refracted and reframed through schools of thinking indigenous to the global south. Global and Insurgent Legalities provides a platform for understanding social, sexual, and colonial inequalities; complex processes of globalization; contemporary cultural conflicts and hybridizations; novel political formations and new modes of democracy and representation; the circulation of non-western concepts of property, sovereignty and individualism; the significance of new technologies of law and digital media; and the legal, political and social impacts of a rapidly changing natural environment.
